Judaism	- the food that observant Jews are permitted to eat
Torah	- Jewish place of worship
	- the first language of millions of Jews living in Eastern Europe
Synagogue	- the Day of Atonement, a day of fasting spent in the synagogue
Passover	<ul> <li>very traditional Jews, mainly found in the shtetls of Eastern Europe</li> </ul>
Shabbat	<ul> <li>Jewish festival in remembrance of when the Jews were led by Moses out of slavery in ancient Egypt</li> </ul>
Rabbi	<ul> <li>a Jewish movement dedicated to establishing a Jewish homeland in Palestine</li> </ul>
Kosher	<ul> <li>the Law of Moses which is the most holy of the religious writings of the Jewish faith; it contains detailed instructions for behaviour in all aspects of Jewish life</li> </ul>
Shtetl	<ul> <li>a Jewish movement in Poland dedicated to bettering the conditions of the Jewish working class and celebrating a</li> </ul>
Yiddish	Yiddish culture
Hebrew	<ul> <li>the Jewish faith, the first to be centred on a belief in one just God</li> </ul>
Orthodox Jews	– Jewish religious leader and teacher
-	<ul> <li>the name given to a town or village in Eastern Europe where the population was almost entirely Jewish</li> </ul>
Assimilated Jews	- the ancient language of the Torah and of prayer and the
Bund	language that many Zionists hoped to revive establishing a Jewish homeland in Palestine
Zionism	<ul> <li>the Jewish Sabbath or day of rest, which is welcomed into the home on Friday evening and ends at sunset on Saturday</li> </ul>
Yom Kippur	- the Jewish New Year, the anniversary of the Creation
Rosh Hashanah	<ul> <li>Jews who did not live separately from the non-Jewish community but had adopted the language, dress and customs of the non-Jewish society in which they lived</li> </ul>
