IMPEACHING A WITNESS

These instructions are for impeaching a witness with his or her previously-sworn statement after the witness has made a statement that is inconsistent with or contradicts something in the previously-sworn statement.

1	REPEAT AND CONFIRM THE INCONSISTENT STATEMENT: "So it is your testimony that?"
2.	ASK WITNESS ABOUT PREVIOUS STATEMENTS:
	"Do you remember giving a witness statement prior to trial?"
	"You swore that you told the truth in that witness statement, correct?"
	[If the witness answers either of these "no," move on to next step anyway]
3.	ASK WITNESS TO IDENTIFY WITNESS STATEMENT:
	"Your honor, may I approach the witness?" [show opposing counsel the statement]
	"You recognize this document as the witness statement you gave on, correct?"
	"This is your signature isn't it?"
	"And it says it was sworn before a notary public?"
	"And this was on [date]?"
4.	READ THE INCONSISTENT STATEMENT:
	"And in this witness statement, you said, isn't that right?"
	Take your time reading the statement and emphasize the most important words.
5.	DO NOT GIVE WITNESS A CHANCE TO EXPLAIN: End the questioning; resist the temptation to ask "when were you lying?" or "that's not your story now?" or similar statements. You may use these types of arguments in closing statement.
